



#### **OUR INSPIRATION**


PRINCIPAL HARBHAJAN SINGH



## A Profile

With a mission to establish an exclusive teacher training institute in the field of education, Sikh Educational Council started a new venture in the form of Sant Baba Hari Singh Memorial Khalsa College of Education (co-education) from the session 2006-07. It is a joint effort of Sikh Educational council, which has achieved a sublime position in the State. The institute is known for high reputation, dedicated faculty, latest methodology of teaching learning and guidance for the professional growth of pupil teacher. In the last 8 years, the college has proved his worth not only in the field of academics, but also outshine in different co-curricular activities.

Sant Baba Hari Singh Memorial Khalsa College of Education is situated within the spacious campus of SGGS Khalsa College, Mahilpur. The college has modern infrastructure, no. of spacious and airy classrooms, well equipped library with a large no. of Reference Books, Encyclopedias, Educational Journals, Newspapers, Magazines, Educational Surveys and many more. The Library is updated according to the latest requirements and curriculum, includes e-library facility with Wi-Fi zone for the students. College has fully air-conditioned Information and Communication Laboratory with printers and internet facility, where pupil teacher learn latest skills of teaching, they are trained with the help of micro teaching, simulation teaching by the demonstration lessons by the teacher educators. Also they are trained in teaching with smart boards. In this lab the pupil teachers get training in speaking and listening languages i.e. English, Hindi and Punjabi. Here under expert guidance, they their selves develop material for correct listening and its reproduction and speaking which is inevitable for a language teacher. The college has a Psychology Lab. with more than 50 psychological tests and equipments for getting the psychological impression of pupil teachers. For the science students, there is a Science Lab. Where the pupil teachers of science are acquainted with the use of scientific equipments in their teaching for making it more understandable and interesting.

Time to time through seminars, workshops, discussions and orientation programs, the students are updated with latest information of the world around through eminent speakers and guest lecturers. For the evolution in teaching methodology, the students get training for the development of supplementary devices as slide shows, working models and educational/language games. The college has been maintaining the decorum of quality and discipline from the very start of the college i.e. from 2006. The expert faculty helps the students not only in the field of teaching learning but also develops multi-dimensional characteristics of the pupil teachers. A multipurpose hall has been put to use for the general function and the seminars in the college. Music Department is also maintained with different musical instruments and music system, which is utilized during cultural programme of the college. Certain other hobbies as optional subjects have been introduced which includes Candle Making, Music (Vocal & Instrumental), Gardening, Interior Decoration and Physical Education. For the seminars or literary events college has a magnificent theater cum auditorium which is an asset to the college building. This auditorium is fitted with latest technology mike and LCD projector used for showing educational films and the videos based on the actual teaching learning situations.

Morning assembly is also one of the features of the college which is conducted daily by house on duty with the help of teacher in-charge. The morning assembly is conducted turn by turn by the various houses Prayer, thought for the day, weekly news, devotional /patriotic songs, skits, lecture on current topics and national anthem are the major events.

The college has also decided uniform for the pupil teachers i.e. camel Salwar Kameez with green Dupatta for girls and for boys off-white shirt, camel trousers, dark green turban and dark green blazer.

Time to time various academic, cultural, recreational and educational celebrations of all the important days and inter-house competitions are organized to develop the feeling of brotherhood and team spirit among pupil teachers. The college has big playgrounds and no. of sports equipments both for outdoor and indoor games. A gymnasium is also provided to the students for the physical development.

The college set up a Red Ribbon Club with the help of Pushpa Gujral Science City Kapurthala for the awareness of AIDS. In the surrounding area of the Mahilpur time to time with the help of different events. The college students make aware the people about AIDS. The college set up an ECO CLUB through which the people are made aware of clean environment, balance of Eco system, clean habitat, and preservation of natural resources

Hostel facility for boy and girls separately is available in the college. Well ventilated rooms with the facility of electricity, Hot and cold water, generator and furniture are provided in these rooms. Canteen and hostel mess facility has been provided to the students. Educational trip and tour is a key feature of this college. To get break from the daily routine, college authorities time to time arrange educational tours. Through these types of programs the pupil teachers are also trained in arranging trip and tours efficiently.

From the session 2008-09 the college got approval for additional 100 seats for the same course and recognition from N.C.T.E. Jaipur for the intake of 50 seats for D.Ed. course affiliated with S.C.E.R.T. Punjab.

During the session 2011-12 the college inspected by NAAC team and accredited with Grade 'B'. The college organized Panjab University Zonal and Inter-Zonal Skill In Teaching and On the Spot Preparation of Teaching Aid Competitions, Panjab University Zonal Youth And Heritage Festivals in 2012 & 2013. The college is also giving the 100% result academically from the last Thirteen years.

#### FEE-STRUCTURE

#### Fee /funds as per the Panjab University Chandigarh and S.C.E.R.T Punjab FINES/DUES

- Absence fine @ Rs. 20/- per day, without information 1.
- Absence from Morning Assembly@ Rs.10/- per assembly 2.
- Uniform fine @ Rs. 20/- per day 3.
- Absence from Tutorials/Seminars and House meeting @ Rs. 50/- per day 4.
- Absence from House Exams. @ Rs. 100/- per exam. 5.
- Absence from College Functions @ Rs. 100/- per day 6.
- Re-admission @ Rs.500/-7.
- Fine for failure to return Library books in time Rs.@5/-per day 8.
- Special fine for the misconduct etc. will depend upon the nature of the offence and may 9. even lead to rustication.

#### Note:-

- 1. Fines will be realized every month. Students will not be allowed to attend the classes till the payment of fines.
- Fee once paid is not refundable.
- 3. The student who absent himself/ herself for 7 days continuously, will be struck off from the College rolls and re-admission will take place only on payment of Rs.500/-.
- 4. The candidate who fails to deposit the fees in time and thus misses his/her chance for admission and will have no further claim for admission.

- If any student does not attend the college within a week from the opening day (as announced by the college) his/her admission will stand cancelled.
- Students from other Universities will have to submit their migration certificates within 30
  days of their admission to the college.
- 7. Students admitted under SC. /ST. Category will have to submit their original SC. / ST. Certificate at the time of admission or else their admission will stand cancelled.
- 8. A late-fee of Rs. 50/- per day shall be charged if fees are not paid by due dates.
- 9. All dues must be cleared before final examinations.

#### **RULES FOR TAKING LEAVE**

- Leave must be got sanctioned personally before it is availed of.
- Application for leave must be signed by the father or the guardian of the applicant. In case of illness, the application should be accompanied by a medical certificate issued by a medical officer.
- The student absenting him/herself from the college without proper leave will be removed from the college rolls.

#### **COLLEGE LIBRARY**

The college library has a valuable collection of books on topics of curriculum as well as general interest.

To keep the stock up to-date, new books are added at regular intervals.

#### **RULES FOR THE ISSUE OF BOOKS**

- No student is permitted to enter the library without his/her identity-cum-library card.
- The student who possess identity card, can get 2 books issued for 8 days. A fine of Rs.10/-per day will be charged after the due date.
- A book issued can be recalled anytime by the librarian.
- Reference Books, Periodicals, Magazines and Newspapers are not to be issued, however they may be used for consultation within the library.
- In case of loss/damage of books borrowed, a student shall be liable to pay the cost of the book lost or defaced/damaged.
- Students are expected to observe silence in the library.
- Students shall keep their belongings at the library entrance with the library attendant.
- The library will be closed once a year for stock checking. All the books borrowed must be returned as notified by the Principal/Librarian.

#### THE COLLEGE HOSTEL

The College has three excellent hostels for Boys and Girls located separately. The hostels provide very congenial and homely atmosphere to students. These hostels are equipped with modern amenities and facilities. These hostels keep a strict vigil on the inmates and discipline of a very high order is maintained in the hostels.

## RULES REGARDING PAYMENT OF HOSTEL CHARGES.

- The amount of security is refundable/adjustable as and when the student leaves the hostel or the mess is closed permanently.
- In case a student does not pay the hostel charges by the due date, it shall be the responsibility of the Warden to insure that such student does not continue to stay / reside in the hostel.
- Once a student is admitted to the hostel he/she cannot stop paying the hostel rent on the plea that he/she has stopped residing in the hostel.
- In order to vacate the hostel accommodation, the student is required to obtain the prior permission of the Provost/Warden and send a prior intimation to the college office positively. If the name of the student is struck off due to non payment of hostel dues from the list of hostlers he/she can be allowed re-admission with the approval of Principal.

#### CANTEEN

The college has its spacious and well furnished two campus canteens separately for boys and girls. The New canteen for the boys is now housed in a double storey building near the main entrance of the College. Both the canteens are inspected daily by the college Resident Medical Officer for the maintenance of proper cleanliness and hygienic conditions. The rate of various articles is fixed by the college authorities. The rate list is displayed at its cash counter. The students are advised to visit the college canteen for light refreshment and meals. Purchases from shops outside the college campus should be discouraged. There is separate seating arrangement for students and members of the staff.

#### DISPENSARY

The college has its own Health Centre and resident Medical Officer is available to the students. They are advised to call at the college clinic whenever indisposed ill. It is better to seek Medical Aid as soon as the need arise, than to allow the disease to become complicated.

#### CAREER INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE BUREAU

The Bureau has been established to guide the students about various opportunities available to them in this age of globalization. Every effort is made to make all information available to the students regarding various courses, competitions etc. Placement Cell of the college makes an endeavor to place the students of the college in various fields of teaching. Special efforts are made to organize the interaction of the Camps students with various schools'/colleges' heads for their placement.

#### STUDENTS CENTRAL ASSOCIATION

It is representative body of the students. The aim of the association is to create qualities like self expression and various extracurricular activities. It helps to make the college functions in a grand success. The members of the Central Association are responsible to maintain discipline in the college.

#### **HEALTH & SPORTS**

It forms an essential and integral part of the college education for all round development of personality of a scholar. Elaborate arrangements exist in the college for physical education of students e.g. Athletics, sports and team games such as hockey, football, volleyball, basketball table tennis, badminton. The college has large number of vast play fields. The members of the staff nominated by the Principal as presidents of various games constitute the sports council. The college also has a large Gymnasium and a hall for indoor games.

#### ECO CLUB

College with the help of the students and teachers is running an eco club which is motivating eco friendly relationship between society and the nature. Members of this club used to visit the local areas and making the people aware of the saving water, growing trees, loving nature, saving birds and animals, global warming etc.

#### HOUSE EXAMINATION

To prepare the students for university examinations, the college normally hold written tests during each semester. Monthly class test will be conducted on any day at the discretion of class teacher.

#### RULES FOR HOUSE EXAMINATION

- Entry to the house test will be allowed on production of the Identity Card.
- It is compulsory for students to appear in house examinations as well as class tests held by the college.
- Exemption from the house examination/class test on account of serious illness or any cogent reason is to be secured from the Principal before the commencement of such examination/class test. Application for permission for exemption should be supported by Medical Certificate bearing the signature of the Parents. No application will be entertained after the examination is over.
- Absence or leave from an examination for whatever reason means nil result and will penalized heavily.
- A student found guilty of unfair means or misbehavior during the examination will be viewed seriously. He/she will be fined Rs. 200/-on each occasion.
- The Principal may at his discretion hold a special test for those who failed to fulfill the conditions prescribed by the Panjab University to take the annual university examination.

#### **COUNTING OF LECTURES**

The counting of lectures shall be from the date of first lecture delivered. Cases of change of subject and late admission will not be entertained in any circumstances. Even if all students fail to turn up in the theory class/composition/practical, they will be marked absent. This lecture will also be counted towards the total number of lectures delivered.85% of the total fectures is compulsory for all the students.

#### **GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT**

#### WHAT STUDENTS SHOULD DO?

- Students should show respect to the teachers and other college officials.
- Behave nicely with the fellow students and show courtesy to the college staff.
- Conduct yourself with dignity, modesty and simplicity.
- Maintain discipline of high order and decorum in the college.
- Cultivate the 'Queue' habit and wait for your turn while depositing fee or getting books issued and elsewhere.
- Be regular and punctual on all occasions.
- Students are expected to come to the college dressed in simple clothes and avoid gaudy dresses.
- Patkas and Caps with flaps are prohibited.
- Movement from one class room to another should invariably be orderly, disciplined and dignified. At the end of each period, students already occupying the room should vacate it completely.
